Keep up your hard work in logging onto bug club to read your reading books. Remember to answer the questions on the pages so that the book will close and I can see which books you have finished. You will earn coins if you do this and be able to play the games too.

Don't forget to access

https://app.gonoodle.com/ look for 'Meow Moo Moo' to join in with which is a new song to help you spot patterns (like banana, banana, meatballs). Also look at 'Consonant Swag' which will help you to remember to blend consonants like s and n, f and l etc.

Also look for the phonics games I have set as to do's on Purple Mash. They can be practise or new learning depending on which ones you do.

This week in maths you could focus on counting in 2s. (If you can already do this try counting backwards in 2s, then look at the 2 Xs tables.)

There are lots of other counting in 2s songs to try so have a look on you tube kids for more.

Have you noticed that all of the numbers in the 2 x table are even numbers. Can you challenge yourself to sort numbers onto odd and even numbers. You could make a little chart like this...

Even Numbers	Odd Numbers
2	1

What patterns do you spot? Ask someone to quiz you eg. Is 7 odd or even? Is 27 odd or even? Is 4odd or even?

Also look for repeated patterns around your house or make some using objects at home or your toys/lego. You could use colours or objects eg. Yellow, yellow, blue then repeat the pattern.
