Home Learning Week 6 - Year 3 – Miss Lungu

Literacy

 Writing – Instructions – Write a set of instructions teaching someone how to do something you enjoy doing. It could be playing a game, brushing your teeth, making something to eat such as a sandwich or how to draw an animal – it is up to you. Remember to use all the features you learnt in Year 2.

You need to include: a title, a short introduction to tell the reader what they are learning to do, a list of things that they need, a picture/drawing of what the finished product should look like and finally, the instructions. Your instructions need to be short and clear. Include time conjunctions such as firstly, secondly, then, next and finally so that your instructions flow and imperative (bossy) verbs such as eat, tidy, put and go so the reader knows exactly what to do. I have made one as an example for you.

- Spellings and handwriting Choose 10 different spellings from your home learning pack to learn. On the sheet, copy the word out three times in your best handwriting. On the back of your sheet challenge yourself and write a sentence for each word!
- Reading Use Active Learn to read the books that have been set for you. 4 or 5 pages are enough to read a day. Retell the story so far to an adult or older sibling. Remember to complete the quizzes once you complete a book.

 Times tables- Practice your times tables using the songs we enjoyed singing and dancing along to in class.
