If you are feeling a bit flat this week have a go at Peanut butter in a cup. See if you can learn it and remember to figure out which way your hips are

Which colour cars did I see an equal amount of?

What is the difference between how many Yellow cars I saw and how many white cars I saw?

Now make a pictograph of your own using purple mash and ask someone to answer questions like mine.

Remember to keep practising adding 1 more and one less to numbers moving on to 10 more and 10 less using a number square. There is a To do on PM to help with this.
