The children in school will be focussing mostly on going over the basics so will be doing plenty of reading, writing, spelling, grammar, handwriting and calculating in maths. You could do the same at home and much of this can be done by continuing to use the **Oak National Academy** online lessons which will be continuing. This week, is Week 9 (22nd June):

- The maths this week is all about coordinates and position.
- English includes reading comprehension, writing an adventure story and some grammar about pronouns, which we have done in class before.
- Other lessons include some science about animal adaptation, lots of geography and some music.
- This week's PSHE lesson is focussed on Black Lives Matters.
- Don't forget, there's also PE with Jo Wicks each day, as well as the PE suggestions provided weekly by the West Lancs Sports Partnership.
- The Oak Academy also has a weekly assembly that you could tune into from Thursday at 11am.
- There is also a section of Activity Clubs that you could join. There's loads of stuff on there, from art, cooking, sports, Scouts and plenty more. Have a go if you can.
