

More fantastic reading going on at home this week!
Well done to all of you for accessing reading in different ways!

Phonics-

This week look at

o-e- like bone, phone

u-e- like tune flute

oo- like boot and spoons

Oo- like book and foot

Some blends to practise- words ending in ct, pt, and xt.

('To dos' set on purple mash or play games on phonics play) Also have a look at BBC Bitesize phonics to see if you can find any of the sounds.



This week in maths you could look at adding and taking away 10 using rods of 10 and blocks for ones. You could represent the tens using straws or towers of 10 lego pieces and ones using single pieces, counters or anything small like grapes.

Have a look at these examples...

$$33+10= 43$$

$$///... + / = ///...$$

Try these...

$$12+10=$$

$$65+10=$$

$$43+1=-$$

$$32+10=$$

$$81+10=$$

$$29+10=$$

Did you notice that the 10s column gets bigger by 1 each time?

Have a go at taking 10 away from the 10s column too.

$$33-10=23$$

///... now remove one of the rods of ten to end up seeing this //...

33

- 10

= 23

When you are confident to do this with the equipment have a go at drawing the rods and blocks and then try without using anything.

Keep working on counting in 2s 5s and 10s too.

We are going to be looking at counting to 100 on go noodle this week. Maybe try purple stew as well just for fun! We are also going to look at Never Eat Soggy Waffles and practise directing each other using north south east and west.



Hi Year One! Some of us have come back to school this week but don't worry if you haven't been able to yet. You will be able to do your work at home to help your brain stay active. We probably won't be able to have sports day this year so why not stage a sports day in your garden. You could use a bag or a pillow case (with parents permission and supervision) to have a go at the sack race and a spoon and small ball to have a go at the egg and spoon race. Don't forget a running race too! Can you beat anybody in your house?

This week in science see if you can find an item from your house that is made of more than one material.

My mirror is made from glass and has a wooden frame. Can you think why. The glass is reflective but the wood is not. The glass is sharp at the edges but the wood is smooth and rounded. Could this be why they used the wood around the edge of the mirror.

The mirror is safer when surrounded by wood but it could not be made of wood alone. Why not?

Can you make up any different types of races for sports day? Have you ever tried a slow race. In this race the last person to cross the line is the winner!

Make sure you have plenty of space and an adult to check that you are safe.

Have a look at the story 'What the Ladybird Heard' on youtube this week. There are some to do's on Purple Mash to go along with the story. You could also write a book review about this story to recommend it to someone else. This should contain three sections. First tell the reader who the main characters are. Remember to use a capital letter. Then Tell the reader what you liked about the story. Give an example from the story. Eg:

I liked it when the lady bird made a plan because all of the animals worked together to catch the robbers and protect the prize winning cow.

The final section should say why you recommend this story and who might enjoy reading it.

Remember...

- * Sound out every word using your phonics.
- * Start each sentence with a capital letter and end with a full stop.
- * Use finger spaces.
- * Use a conjunction like... And, because, but, so.
- * Use your best writing. Start on the line and walk in and out of your letters.
- * Remember capital letters for the names of places and people.

Have a go at writing a list of people you would like to see after lockdown or places you would like to visit. Remember to use a capital letter for each of their names and put each person or place on their own line. Do you remember when we used bullet points to organise a list. Can you do this too?
