Fractions— Check out the new to dos about fractions on purple mash.

This week we are looking at finding half of a shape and a quarter of a shape, moving on to looking for 3 quarters too.



A half is found when you split something into two equal (the same as each other) sides. It can be written by putting 1 above 2 because you are stating that you have 1 out of the 2 sides. You can find half of a shape or an even number. Eg- half of 4 is 2.

A quarter can be found when you split something into 4 equal parts. One out of the four can be described as a quarter. You can split even numbers into four equal groups and find a quarter of a number too. Eg-1 quarter o olo olo oloo

What can you find around the house that can be split into equal parts? Half of a 1 sock

pair of socks is

Look for things that you can split in half or quarters. Maybe one night you will have pizza for tea. I wonder who will eat half a pizza? You can make a pizza of your own using a paper plate or circle of paper/card and split it into equal parts.

Can you split a piece of fruit into quarters (four equal parts)? (ask for help if you are cutting).

Get a piece of paper and fold it once to make 2 halves the again to make 4 quarters. Can you label them and put them up

like a poster to help you remember.
