ENGLISH

Reading:

Year 2 will be looking at a range of fiction texts this half term. Our class novel is 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory'. English sessions will focus on the reading of a new, short story each week including: 'The Day the Crayon's Quit' 'The dinosaur that pooped the planet' and 'Georges Marvellous Medicine'. The children will be analysing character traits, discussing, and clarifying the meaning of vocabulary, developing inference skills and both asking and answering questions based upon what has been read to them. Children will be continuously developing their phonics knowledge and understanding as they read and sound out unfamiliar words. Guided reading and comprehension session every Friday AM will continue to take place to support children's confidence and skills development in reading.

<u>Writing:</u>

The children will be developing their writing skills for a variety of purposes- to describe, to inform. Year 2 will be listening to a variety of stories which they will use within their writing. The children will analyse character traits from a range of texts and will adapt and analyse key features and vocabulary. Year 2 will write a letter from the perspective of a crayon in 'The Day the Crayons Quit' to describe their emotions, sharing understanding from the text. In year 2, we will also be looking at how different both fiction and non-fiction texts can be, comparing these and attempting to write both to widens children's knowledge and understanding of different texts.


MATHS

The children will be discussing, recognising, and using the symbols for pounds (£) and pence (p) in their learning. Children will be able to recognise that combinations of coins can total the same amounts and we will be looking at practical uses of money involving the subtraction of amounts to find change.

This half term, the children will be learning about multiplication and division using grouping and sharing methods. The children will be using a range of concrete resources to support their knowledge and understanding of these concepts while making it real for the children. Year 2 will also be developing their arithmetic and reasoning skills applying a suitable method to solve their problems.

ART-Painting and Mixed Media

This half term the children will be developing their skills in painting and mixed media. The class will make choices about which materials to use for collage based on colour, shape and pattern, experimenting with overlapping and layering materials to create interesting effects.

<u>MUSIC-</u> The children will be looking at how pulse and rhythm are important within music. Children will be able to experiment with body percussion and will be able to see the effects of this in a piece of music.

<u>PE-</u> The children will participate in weekly PE sessions focusing on developing their skills in Movement, Balance and Gymnastics delivered by WLSSP.

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COMPUTING- 2Design

This half term the children will be developing their computing skills using search engines to retrieve information online and allow the children to recognise the uses of IT beyond school.

SCIENCE- Animals including humans

The children will explore why healthy eating is important and will be able to categorise the different food groups onto an eat well plate. Children will be able to recognise why being healthy and having a balanced diet is important and they will be able to describe and illustrate why exercise is important and how it benefits the human body. The class will then begin to compare humans to animals and discuss the similarities and differences of what each one needs to survive. This will include the life cycle of both the human and a frog looking at both of their needs for survival and addressing the topic of growth.
