

Parts of speech

Grammar is the study of the way we use words to make **sentences**. Words can be divided into groups called **parts of speech** (or word classes). Six **parts of speech** are **nouns**, **adjectives**, **verbs**, **adverbs**, **pronouns** and **prepositions**.



He looked carefully at the elastic bandage around Amy's knee.

This is a **pronoun**. It stands **in place of a noun**.

This is an adverb. It tells us more about a verb.

This is a **preposition**. It tells us the **position** of one thing in relation to another.

This is a **noun**. A noun is a **naming word**.

This is a **verb**. It describes **actions**.

This is an **adjective**. It is a **describing** word. It **tells us more about a noun**.
